

This document is intended to supplement the existing eCopy 2009 Product Overview with information specific to the eCopy PaperWorks 2009.1 release. For additional information, please refer to the Product Overview available on the eCopy Solutions Provider Network (eSPN).

How is eCopy PaperWorks 2009.1 different from eCopy PaperWorks 2009?

eCopy PaperWorks 2009.1 is a point release that includes all functionality found in eCopy PaperWorks 2009, as well as bug fixes, and support for Microsoft Windows 7 and 64-bit operating systems. Additionally, the readIRIS™OCR engine has been replaced with the Nuance OmniPage 16 engine. DataLogics Adobe PDF Library has been replaced with Zeon's DocuCom PDF CoreLibrary. These changes were made "under the hood" and will present no changes to the user experience.

When will eCopy PaperWorks be available?

eCopy PaperWorks 2009.1 will be available for purchase as of January 1, 2010. Currently shipping eCopy 2009 will no longer be available as of that date.

Will eCopy Paper Works 2009.1 continue to be bundled with eCopy ShareScan®?

Yes, eCopy PaperWorks will be bundled with eCopy ShareScan products. As of January 1, 2010 all ShareScan bundles will ship with eCopy PaperWorks 2009.1. For a short period of time, eCopy ShareScan will continue to leverage the readIRIS OCR engine. This "mixed-OCR-engine" scenario will not impact end users, as each engine is completely independent of one another. Also, the PDF documents created by eCopy PaperWorks and by the eCopy ShareScan products will continue to be fully compatible.

What happens if my customer is using eCopy Desktop or eCopy PaperWorks 2009 and wants to upgrade to eCopy PaperWorks 2009.1?

As with eCopy PaperWorks 2009, there is no upgrade from eCopy Desktop to eCopy PaperWorks; users with valid M&S will be able to download and install the new software from the Upgrade Center on the eCopy Product Registration site, per the terms of their M&S agreement. Users will still have access to any stamps or documents created with eCopy Desktop.

For those customers using eCopy PaperWorks 2009, the new version of the software will install over the existing application, replacing the PDF libraries and OCR engines.

What if a customer has standardized on a different OCR engine?

With the release of eCopy PaperWorks 2009.1, Nuance's industry-leading OmniPage will be the only supported OCR engine.
